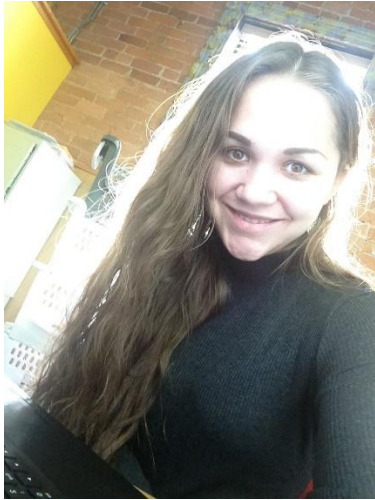
Ana Carretié
